## Record of Discussion of Online Session of Capacity Building Programme for Promoting Positive Mental Health, Resilience, and Wellbeing, held on 18.07.2025 at 10:00 AM

- 1. An online session of the Capacity Building Programme for Promoting Positive Mental Health, Resilience, and Wellbeing in Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) was held on 18th July 2025 at 10:00 AM. The session was organised for nominated faculty members from centrally funded HEIs under the guidance of the Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education. A total of 88 participants joined the session, of whom 80 were faculty members.
- 2. This was the 27<sup>th</sup> online session in the ongoing fortnightly series since the programme's launch in May 2024. The initiative has engaged over 1,900 faculty members from more than 160 HEIs, fostering institutional ecosystems sensitive to mental health and aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The session was opened by Mr. Devendra Kumar Sharma, Director, Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, who emphasized the unique role of faculty as first responders and anchors of a supportive environment for students, particularly in managing transitional challenges from school to university life. He highlighted the growing need for qualified mental health professionals and faculty sensitisation, especially post-pandemic, and encouraged proactive faculty engagement through open communication and mentorship.
- 3. Prof. Kumar Suresh, NIEPA, stressed the need for integrating mental health promotion into institutional culture through reflective practices. He called for faculty to develop empathy, self-awareness, and communication skills as life skills, vital for fostering a harmonious campus climate. He emphasised that vibrant and mentally healthy campuses thrive on active community engagement, peer counselling, and inclusive interactions involving families, alumni, and local communities.
- 4. The following resource persons were introduced to take the session ahead:

  - Dr. Avlokita Agrawal, Associate Professor, IIT Roorkee
- 5. Dr. Jitendra Nagpal contributed his insights on the need for a holistic and ecosystem-wide approach to mental health in higher education institutions. Emphasizing that mental health is not solely the responsibility of counselling centres, he called for collective engagement by faculty, staff, families, and alumni. He underlined the importance of creating campus cultures where student well-being is a shared priority and not an isolated intervention.
- 6. Dr. Nagpal highlighted the significance of integrating mental health awareness into institutional frameworks, suggesting that student hostels can serve as vital sub-units for fostering community support and early intervention. He advocated for structured mentorship models within hostels, where seniors, peers, and faculty could collaborate in creating supportive networks. Drawing attention to practices from the medical education sector, such as community engagement programs linked with professional training, he recommended adopting similar outreach models in technical and higher education institutions.
- 7. He also proposed that alumni be actively involved as mentors and role models, sharing experiences related not just to academic success but also to personal well-being, resilience, and life balance. Dr. Nagpal emphasized the need for ongoing action research to study the long-term impact of mental

health initiatives on student development and institutional culture. He encouraged the sharing of best practices across institutions through regular forums and highlighted the role of compassionate leadership in shaping resilient academic communities.

- 8. Ms. Geeta Mehrotra, in an engaging dialogue with participants, steered the discussion towards understanding student stressors, the significance of empathy, and the evolving aspirations of youth. She highlighted the importance of life skills in decision-making, problem-solving, and maintaining emotional balance. She engaged in an extended discussion on the importance of life skills and their application through an example of a film scene from the film *Lage Raho Munna* Bhai. Faculty shared insights on stress among students and teachers alike, suggesting physical activity, open communication, and peer support as practical strategies.
- 9. Dr. Avlokita Agrawal presented a detailed account of mental health initiatives undertaken at the Wellness Centre at IIT Roorkee, showcasing a practical model of how institutional efforts can address student well-being effectively. She shared that IIT Roorkee had established a dedicated wellness centre in 2009, designed to proactively foster mental health awareness, reduce stigma, and offer both professional counselling and recreational activities aimed at enhancing student interaction and community building. The Wellness Centre has a strength of 9 wellbeing professional on roll and new recruitments are underway.
- 10. Dr. Agrawal stressed that the centre operates on principles of confidentiality and accessibility, staffed by trained psychologists, and offering multiple channels for students to seek help, including face-to-face counselling, telephonic support, and anonymous outreach mechanisms. The Centre hold orientation programmes for not only students but also parents.
- 11. Dr. Agrawal shared that the hostels are IIT Roorkee are visited weekly by counsellors. This initiative's success is reflected in the increasing number of students coming forward to access support services, which Dr. Agrawal noted as a positive indicator of diminishing stigma around mental health on campus. Increasing numbers of students reaching out the Wellness Centres for counselling reflects positively on the efforts made by the team at IIT Roorkee to create a facilitative campus culture.
- 12. She emphasized the significance of student-led initiatives in promoting mental well-being and fostering peer support networks, highlighting that empowering students as change agents can transform the campus climate. Furthermore, she advocated for continuous sensitization of faculty and staff, ensuring that every member of the institution is attuned to recognizing and addressing signs of mental distress among students. Dr. Agrawal concluded by inviting collaboration and knowledge-sharing between institutions, offering IIT Roorkee's model as a case study for future sessions in the series.
