Participants and Eligibility

Faculty from centrally-funded institutes, Institutes of National Importance, as well as UGC and AICTE-recognized universities, colleges, standalone institutes and private universities. The participants must be permanent faculty at recognized institutes with at least 3 years of teaching experience. Each participating institute is permitted to nominate a maximum of two faculty members.

Samaleswari Temple

Beyond its architectural beauty, Samaleswari Temple plays a pivotal role in the sociocultural fabric of Western Odisha. Throughout the year, vibrant festivals like Dhabalabesa, Nuakhai, and Pua Juntia pulsate with life, bringing the community together.



Hirakud Dam

Nestled just 16 kilometers from Sambalpur, Hirakud Dam beckons with not just its grandeur, but a treasure trove of experiences. Explore the mighty dam itself, or take a scenic drive along the left or right dyke. Ascend Gandhi Minar or Jawahar Minar for breathtaking panoramas of the reservoir.



Debrigarh Wildlife Sanctuary

The wonders don't stop there! Just 4 kilometers away in Burla, the APJ Abdul Kalam Planetarium & Science Park offers a fascinating glimpse into space and scientific marvels. And for wildlife enthusiasts, the right dyke conveniently leads to the entry point of the famed Debrigarh Wildlife Sanctuary in Bargarh district. From the dam's majesty to the sanctuary's diverse creatures, Hirakud promises an unforgettable adventure for every kind of traveler.



Ghanteswari and Chipilima Hydroelectric Project

Eighteen kilometers downstream from Sambalpur, a detour on the Mahanadi River unveils Chipilima. Seek blessings at the Ghanteswari Temple, adorned with countless bells that chime in the breeze. Witness the engineering marvel of the Chipilima Hydroelectric Plant, nestled amidst scenic hills. The route to Chipilima winds through picturesque foothills, adding to the charm.



Watersports Activities at Zero Point (Dyke Road)

Akela Adventure Water Sports (Water sports Vendor) is located on Burla's Right Dyke Road and offers an exciting range of water activities including paragliding, jet skiing, pedal boating, speed boating, kayaking, cruises, family boats, bumper rides, and banana rides. Pricing for each ride is listed in the QR code, so you can make the most of this thrilling experience.



Master weavers from the Meher community preserve the great legacy of Sambalpuri handloom weaving in Jhiliminda village, Bargarh district, Odisha. This elaborate technique requires a careful procedure called as Baandha, in which threads are tie-dyed to produce bright patterns before weaving. The method starts with selecting fine cotton or silk yarns, which are then tied in precise patterns to prevent dye absorption. Following dyeing, the yarns are painstakingly woven on handlooms to create the finished cloth. This labor-intensive approach necessitates exceptional expertise and might take several months and even several years to

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finish a single saree, depending on the complexity of the design. In Jhiliminda, a self-help group of 13 master weavers works together to create one-of-a-kind handloom products such as sarees, shirts, and bed covers. These artists frequently sell their creations through local agents or cooperatives such as Sambalpuri Bastralaya, which assist promote and distribute the products to a larger audience. Despite problems such as competition from machine-made textiles and restricted access to contemporary materials, Jhiliminda weavers remain committed to preserving their ancient skill, making substantial contributions to the region's cultural and economic fabric.



Event on leadership held at IIM Sambalpur

Sambhar, June 24: Aligned with the National Educational Policy (NEP) framework recently conducted "Nurturing Future Leadership Programme" (NLP) under the Mahatma Mission Teacher Training Programme (MMTPP).

POSSIBLE ROUTES TO REACH SAMBALPUR

To reach Sambalpur, you can use various modes of transportation such as train, bus, and flight.



By Train

Sambalpur has its own railway station named Sambalpur Junction (SBP), along with two other Railway stations namely Hirakud Junction (HKG) and Sambalpur City in Sambalpur. There are direct Train Connections to the prominent cities across India, which is well connected to major cities across India. You can take a direct train from cities like Mumbai, Delhi, Bangalore, Chennai, Howrah, Ahmedabad, Surat, and Jaipur to Sambalpur Junction.



By Bus

Sambalpur is connected with a robust network of National Highways, making it easily accessible by road. The major road connecting Sambalpur is the National Highway 53 (NH53). You can drive via NH48 and NH53, with possible stops at Pune, Raipur, Agra, Lucknow, Ranchi, and Nagpur.



By Flight

The nearest airport to Sambalpur is Veer Surendra Sai Airport, Jharsuguda (JRG), located almost 80 kms away from the campus that connects the western part of the state with major metropolitans like Bangalore, Kolkata, New Delhi and Mumbai on a regular basis. The new closest airport is Veerbhadra Airport (RPR) in Raipur, Chhattisgarh, which is approximately 262 kilometers away. Another nearby option is the Biju Patnaik International Airport (BBI) in Bhubaneswar, around 326 kilometers away. You can fly to Raipur or Bhubaneswar and then take a train or bus to Sambalpur.

Further to reach IIM Sambalpur campus, you can follow these directions. The Indian Institute of Management Sambalpur is located approximately 5 km from Hirakud Railway Station, 27 km from the District Headquarters Sambalpur, and 55 km from Jharsuguda Airport. To reach the IIM Sambalpur campus, you can take a train or bus to Sambalpur and then hire a taxi or take a local bus from the railway station or bus stand to the campus. Alternatively, you can also book a cab or drive directly to the campus if you are coming by your own vehicle.



LODGING AND BOARDING

Transportation by bus and cab from the airport and railway station to the campus will be available as a paid service.

All necessary arrangements for your accommodation (single occupancy) and meals will be made at the Guest House located within the IIM Sambalpur campus, to ensure a comfortable and pleasant stay during your visit.
